Urwick, in 33 cases of pulmonary tuberculosis in all stages, found the index below 1.0 in some cases, as high as 2.6 in others, and in one the index was 1.0. As can be seen by these very few references, the opsonic index varies a great deal according to the type of the disease under observation, whether it be a case of lupus or instances of pulmonary involvement. Then, again, it is noticed that the index is changed at different hours of the day, and also according to whether the patient be bed-fast or able to get about and take some light exercise. Another variable index (though the normal is regarded as 1.0) is the one usually noticed in diseases of the eyeball, in which cases the index is usually above 1.0, as 1.3 and 1.5.
